Life Learning Unit

Students study and make preparations for their participation in school festivals and sports days. They also learn how to use different kinds of public facilities and public transport.

Task Learning

Students engage in craftwork, pottery, or woodwork. This allows them to experience the pleasure of creating objects, while cultivating the basic skills and attitudes necessary for work at the same time.

Integrating Learning (alternative class)

Students can select the subjects that personally interest them (art, culture, sport) and each student pursues activities in accordance with their particular interests.

Upper Secondary Department

<u>Task Learning</u> To give students self-confidence, help them develop appropriate attitudes, and motivate them, students engage in work-related tasks and activities.

Occupations To enable students to decide on what career they want to pursue, they receive training on self-understanding and awareness of society.

Home Students learn the skills they need to engage in social/daily activities after graduation (cooking, laundry, shopping, etc.).

Integrated Research (alternative class)

Based on their individual interests, students pursue these interests and enjoy performing a variety of activities that will help them to spend their leisure time in rewarding ways after graduation.

Study Room in Elementary/Lower Secondary Schools

In Fuzoku elementary and lower secondary schools, we provide independent study rooms for students who are not able to participate in class. We support their study individually and counsel them to help them overcome their problems.

Community Support Projects

O The "Suginoko classroom"

The "Suginoko classroom" is part of the school's community activities. It is a study group for the guardians and childcare workers etc. of children with special needs or whose development is delayed. The aim of the group is to find the best ways of caring for infants and to support the independence of children by considering these matters collectively. The group engages in a wide range of activities depending on the needs of the participants, such as round table discussions, lectures by university teaching staff, observation of lessons, and tours of facilities, etc.

O Educational counseling, and training workshop support

As a part of our community support projects, we offer educational counseling and information on understanding disability etc., to the guardians of children with disabilities, and to the staff involved in the childcare or education of disabled children, etc. In addition, we provide consultative support by visiting nurseries, schools and other facilities, and by dispatching lecturers to staff training workshops etc.
